# **Key Achievements**

#### **Members:**

We represent the majority of professional dog walkers in Auckland



Members and 9 associate members



We sent out **12** member update emails including **5** special bylaw reminder updates

We consulted on what members think about the code of conduct and minimum standards with 25 responses

## **Council Bylaw:**



Signatures for our petition against the Council Bylaw

Attended 13 local board meetings to advocate for professional dog walkers



**60 members** had their say told us what they thought about council proposal

We made 3 formal submissions on the Council Bylaw proposal, 1 written submission of 47 pages and 2 oral submissions.







#### **Code of Conduct:**



We created a member code of conduct which applies to every member



We are well underway with a set of minimum standards for dog walkers.

We set up a complaints process which sets out how complaints received by PDWA are managed and considered which is working well.



Complaints were received up to 30 June 2025 with **three** closed after receiving responses from the dog walker in question and one in initial stages.

#### Website and Socials:

We established PDWA social media accounts which are now a key communication channels



We set up our website which can have exclusive member only resources and provide a space to inform the public about dog walking



We set up a new members only facebook group for members to discuss dog walking and association topics

Committee meetings over the past year with a 98% attendance rate
